At our recent leadership meeting with City of Hagerstown officials, Lt. Alexander with HPD discussed crime activity in Hagerstown. There has been a rise in auto thefts, and thefts of items from vehicles. If you see something, say something. A few simple tips to remember:

- Do not leave your keys in the car.

The City of Hagerstown enforces a noise ordinance. In residential areas, noises louder than 65 dBA during the day, and 55 dBA at night are in violation of the noise ordinance. Weekday hours are 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.; weekday evening begins on Sunday. Weekend hours are 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.; weekend evening begins on Friday. Concerns about excessive noise needs to be directed to HPD.

RED – Electric Power Lines, Cables, Conduit and Lighting Cables
<b>YELLOW</b> – Gas, Oil, Steam, Petroleum or Gaseous Materials
ORANGE - Communication, Alarm or Signal Lines, Cables or Conduit
BLUE - Potable Water
PURPLE – Reclaimed Water, Irrigation and Slurry Lines
GREEN - Sewers and Drain Lines
