#### **SNOW REMINDERS**

In the event of snow, please do not park on the streets. For the snow plow to get through our neighborhood in a timely manner, and do the best job possible, please park in your driveways. Any damages incurred are owner responsibility.

You are responsible for shoveling your driveway, and the sidewalk in front of and around your property. Please do not throw snow into the street. After measurable snow, your sidewalks need to be passable within 24 hours of ceased snowfall.



To ensure the mail carrier can safely deliver your mail, please remember to clear the snow in front of your mailbox. Additionally, ensure that storm drains are cleared for faster exit of melted snow, and fire hydrants need to be exposed.

Please be considerate of your neighbors while clearing snow. If possible, take a moment to check on neighbors that may be in need.

Do not save cleared parking spaces on the street with any objects. Remember, if you did not shovel the spot, do not park in the spot.



Reminder: Holiday decorations need to be removed by January 15<sup>th</sup> to avoid violations.

The City will not shovel the interior park sidewalks. However, exterior sidewalks will be cleared for passage.

Keep your water heater vent cleared in the event of measurable snow to prevent carbon monoxide buildup.

Be mindful of the type of ice melt you use. Make sure the ice melt is safe for concrete to avoid pitting and cracking of the sidewalk.



Please make sure children are not in the streets during snow removal. Snow drifting can prevent drivers from seeing small children. If you're driving, please watch for children. **Do not walk on the pond.**
